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### REQUESTED ACTION:

That the Workforce Development Board Nominations/Membership Committee authorize the Executive Director to issue a public call for nominations to fill vacancies on the Workforce Development Board (WDB).

### BACKGROUND:

The Agreement between the City of Los Angeles and Workforce Development Board of the City of Los Angeles (WDB-LEO) requires the Nominations/Membership Committee to meet semi-annually to solicit and receive recommendations from business, labor, education, community-based service providers, and other interested individuals and groups to fill vacancies on the WDB. The WDB must then transmit any nominations for WDB members to the Mayor and City Council by March 1 of each year.

The Executive Director inquired with 12 WDB Members whose terms expire in June 2026 on whether they would like to be considered for reappointment to the WDB. A total of 11 Board Members confirmed interest.

Assuming the WDB forwards 11 reappointments for consideration, the WDB will surpass its minimum membership requirement of 23 (with a total of 24 members). The WDB will then have

the option to fill an additional 15 vacancies to reach a maximum membership of 39, subject to the WIOA requirements noted below.

As required under WIOA Section 107(b)(2)(A), a majority of the WDB's voting membership shall be representatives of business. Under CA Unemployment Insurance Code § 14202 (2024), at least 20% of the WDB's voting membership shall be representatives of the workforce, with a minimum of 15% being representatives of labor organizations who have been nominated by local labor federations.

Other individuals may be appointed to the WDB at the Mayor's discretion and subject to confirmation by the City Council. They may include representatives from community-based organizations, philanthropic organizations, older worker organizations, government agencies, transportation agencies, Job Corps, etc.

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### REQUESTED ACTION:

That the Workforce Development Board Nominations/Membership Committee authorize the Executive Director to issue a public call for nominations to fill vacancies on the Workforce Development Board (WDB) Youth Council.

### BACKGROUND:

The City of Los Angeles Workforce Development Board (WDB) operates in accordance with its ByLaws and the WDB-Local Elected Official (WDB-LEO) Agreement. The ByLaws require the Nominations/Membership Committee meet semi-annually to solicit and receive recommendations to fill vacancies for non-voting members on the WDB Youth Council. Youth Council members who are non-WDB members are considered non-voting members. The Committee must then forward the nominations to the WDB for approval.

The WDB Youth Council is comprised of the Youth Council Chair/President, WDB voting members, and non-voting members. Youth Council membership is capped at 19. The Youth Council is currently comprised of 11 members: six (6) WDB voting members and five (5) non-voting members.

The Executive Director inquired with one (1) non-voting Youth Council Member whose term expires in June 2026 on whether they would like to be considered for reappointment. They confirmed their interest. Assuming the WDB approves the reappointment, the WDB Youth Council will then have the option to fill an additional eight vacancies.

In accordance with the California Legislature, if a local Workforce Development Board appoints members to any standing committee on the provision of youth services, they shall endeavor to appoint:

- Representatives of youth who are enrolled in school and out-of-school youth.
- Representatives from the private sector.
- Representatives of local educational agencies serving youth.
- Representatives of private nonprofit agencies serving youth.
- Representatives of apprenticeship training programs serving youth.

## Process Overview

Nominations are managed by the WDB Executive Director and Nominations/Membership Committee

- Executive Director issues call for nominations.
- Nominations/Membership Committee reviews and vets nominees.
- WDB Youth Council nominees are forwarded to the WDB for review and final approval.
- WDB nominees are forwarded to the WDB for review and then the Mayor for consideration. Mayor appointments are confirmed by the City Council.

Process is defined in the WDB By-Laws & WDB-Local Elected Official (LEO) Agreement.

*Note: A nomination list is valid for up to one year after the date of submission to the Mayor. The Mayor may choose to use the nomination list to fill new vacancies that occur or may request that the WDB Nominations/Membership Committee solicit new nominations for such vacancies.*





# Roles and Timeline

Jan 15	<b>WDB Executive Director</b> issues public call for nominations <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Nominee names and resumes must be submitted within 15 days (Due Jan. 29th).</li> </ul>
Feb 04	<b>Nominations/Membership Committee</b> reviews, vets, and forwards nominees to the WDB.
Feb 12	<b>Executive Committee</b> approves nominees.
Mar 01	<b>WDB</b> submits vacancy and nominee letter to Mayor.
TBD	<b>Mayor</b> transmits appointments to City Council within 30 days.
TBD	<b>City Council</b> confirms appointments.
May 21	<b>Full WDB</b> approves Youth Council nominees – only requires WDB approval.



## Sources of WDB Nominations

### Business

- Chambers of Commerce
- Minority, and women business organizations
- Nominees should be from industry sectors of high growth/living wage/have occupational career ladders*

### Education & Literacy

- Adult education, community colleges, institutes of higher education
- Vocational, local private business and proprietary schools

### Labor

- Labor federations
- Joint labor-management partnerships
- Apprenticeship program operators

### Economic & Community Development

- Local economic and community development agencies
- Public, private, and nonprofit agencies

### Required State Partners

- EDD (Wagner-Peyser, UI, Veterans, LMI, TAA)
- California Department of Rehabilitation

### Other Nominations

- Community-based organizations
- Philanthropy, older worker organization, government, transportation, Job Corps, etc.
